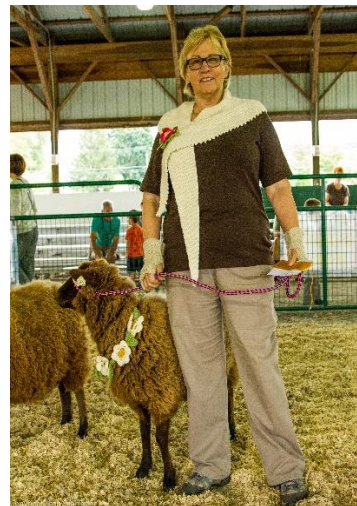

Georgia's Sheep Won More Ribbons This Year!



Our President, Georgia Muhs, with her Grand Champion Ewe, Mocha, at the Garden State Sheep and Fiber Festival in September. In addition to this title, Georgia & Mocha won a First Place Ribbon in the Shepherds' Lead Class. Georgia's daughter, granddaughter, and another close friend won ribbons leading Belle and Truffles, two other of Georgia's "sheep family".



This year Barbara Osmolski joined the fun! Barb led Babette, a one year old brown American Shetland, and together they won a Third Place Ribbon in the Shepherds' Lead Class. Barb is wearing a wool scarf embellished with flowers, and Babette is wearing a necklace made of a wool "i" cord with flowers, all of which were knitted by Barb especially for this event.

THIS MONTH'S PROJECT/TECHNIQUE(S):

Oct. 16 we will be working on a knitted Two-Colored Scarf, led by Doris G.

This will be a segment from a scarf made using two colors of the same weight yarn and needles appropriate for the chosen yarns. Members should bring enough yarn to work

over 38 stitches and 16 rows. Two colors of scrap yarn would be perfect as long as you have enough (specific yardage is undetermined).

The pattern for this project will be sent as a separate attachment to the Newsletter email. Please print out your own copy and bring it with you if you intend to participate in this project.

Oct. 23 we will be working on knitting with beads, using patterns for projects that Meredith H. demonstrated in the Spring.

Please let Meredith know if you are interested in a beaded project for this meeting, so that she can be prepared to help. Meredith will be available for consultation to get you started as well as while you are working. The beaded bag project has an online source (listed below). The bracelet pattern is from a class taken by Meredith, and she will have the information you need. She will also bring samples for members to see at the Oct. 16th meeting. Suggested materials and sources are listed below.

For a beaded bag: Perle 8 cotton and US size **0000** needles.

Czech Size 11 beads on hanks.

For a beaded bracelet: size 6 beads (ACMoore is a good source).

Worsted weight yarn, a metallic mix or a smooth type, non-woolly.

Size 1 and 2 needles, and a dental floss threader.

Also on Oct. 23 there will be videos set up for viewing, showing us how to incorporate beads into knitted items such as the edge of a scarf or the cuff of a sweater. Bring your knitting and crocheting and watch with us!

OUTREACH

If you know of any local non-profit organizations who are struggling and who would benefit from knitted and crocheted items made by our members, please let us know and I will happily include them here.

“Hope for Veterans”- Items Always Needed: Men and Women Veterans who live in the residence associated with the Lyons Veterans’ Hospital in Liberty Corner, NJ, are in need of hats, scarves and socks. These are veterans who cannot go out to get their own supplies so we would like to help out by using our talents to make the items they need. A reminder that it is preferred that we do not visit the facility, so a contact from the residence has agreed to pick up whatever we can donate by meeting a Guild member at the library.

PLEASE NOTE: Barbara Osmolski or Mary Shanahan will collect finished items and arrange delivery to organization representatives.

Warm Up America: An ongoing project, the goal of this nation-wide effort is to provide warm crocheted or knitted afghans to anyone in need. They are distributed by The Red Cross and Salvation Army to victims of natural disasters, area homeless, and to families and individuals who have lost their homes and belongings due to fire, flood or tornadoes. Forty-nine blocks that measure 7” X 9” are joined together to complete an afghan. Use your scrap yarn to make some 7”x 9” knitted and/or crocheted blocks and bring them to a meeting. Myra will continue to collect them throughout the year.
